


2 Current Situation of Fukui City

As of the end of December 2018, the of registered foreign number residents in Fukui City reached 4,442. This is about 1.68% of the total population of Fukui City, and is the highest percentage ever.

In regards to nationality, foreign residents come from 61 different countries/territories. The number of those from Southeast Asian countries such as Vietnam and the Philippines has increased.



Changes in total population and Number of foreign residents




In regards to residence status, the number of technical interns and students has increased in recent years. As of the end of 2018, the percentage of technical interns surpassed 26%, the highest of all other demographics. The number of foreigners staying in Fukui City for a certain period of time to train/study has been increasing when compared to the previous revision.

The number of foreign workers in Japan is expected to increase as a result of the introduction of the new residence status classification, the Specified Skilled Worker, in April, 2019.
