

Get Rid of Second-Hand Smoking!

Last year, July 2018, Health Promotion Act was revised in order to reduce second-hand smoking as much as possible. Due to this, the general rules around smoking have been changed.

- Smoking in public buildings will be prohibited.

In order to keep second-hand smoking to a minimum, smoking will be prohibited in all public buildings with heavy traffic. These regulations go into effect starting April 2020. Offenders will face legal consequences.

- Hospitals, Schools, etc.
 - ◇ Schools, Children's Centers, Hospitals, Government Buildings, etc.
 - ◇ Smoking prohibited on their premises, effective July 1, 2019.
 - ◇ *These places may have specifically designated smoking areas outdoors. In that case, you are allowed to smoke in only those designated areas.
- Offices, Workplaces, etc.
 - ◇ Offices, Construction sites, Hotels/Lodgings, Trains/Railways, Ferries/Passenger boats, and any other public establishment
 - ◇ Smoking prohibited on their premises, effective April 1, 2020.
 - ◇ *These places may have specifically designated smoking rooms for any type of tobacco products (heat-not-burn products, electric cigarettes, cigarettes, etc.). In that case, you are allowed to smoke in only those designated areas.
- Eateries/Restaurants
 - ◇ Smoking prohibited on their premises, effective April 1, 2020.
 - ◇ *These places may have specifically designated smoking rooms for any type of tobacco products (heat-not-burn products, electric cigarettes, cigarettes, etc.). For privately owned "smaller" businesses, measures are being taken to transition towards smoke-free environments.

*Some establishments originally made to accommodate customers that smoke. As a result, you are allowed to smoke at the following establishments.

- Bars or any other similar establishment specifically allowing indoor smoking
- Tobacco shops that allow smoking indoors
- Designated, public smoking areas

If there is space provided specifically for smoking...

- The establishment must have a sign saying there is a smoking area on the premise.
 - Most establishments should have their sign visible from the entrance.
- There will be specific signs warning those under the age of 20 to not enter certain areas (smoking areas). This includes both indoor and outdoor smoking areas.

Basically, it will soon be illegal to smoke in public buildings in order to reduce second-hand smoking as much as possible. Some areas have designated smoking areas, and if they do have smoking areas, that information should be easily accessible. Any smoke-free, public establishment should have a sign indicating so visible from the entrance. If not, **THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT YOU CAN SMOKE ON THE PREMISES!** Please be sure to ask if this is ever the case.
